

School Development Plan – School Goal

Student achievement in mathematics will improve.




School Development Plan – Outcome

 Students' oral language will improve through sharing their mathematical thinking in complete sentences.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- Report card data:
- English Language Arts and Literacy (ELAL) Oral Language; Makes meaning and connections through oral language
- French Language Arts and Literature (FILA)-Oral Language; Speaks to communicate information and ideas
- ELAL/FILAL, Math; Understands and applies concepts related to number and patterns.
- EAL benchmark analytics
- overall speaking proficiency level








School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Oral Language: measure student use of a complete sentence when sharing their mathematical thinking in complete sentences; 3x/year
- Perception Survey; Oral Language, students' overall confidence in sharing their mathematical thinking in complete sentences.
- Teacher perception data: teachers' confidence in teaching using the Neurolinguistic Approach and Math Talks; 3 x a year





School Development Plan – Learning Excellence Actions

- Use of Neurolinguistic Approach (NLA) for language acquisition- focus on oral language
- Model consistently and explicitly the use of mathematical language to ensure specific vocabulary acquisition (Frayer Model)
- Posing purposeful questions to elicit mathematical discourse
- Use Math Talks as a tool to communicate a complete sentence when orally explaining mathematical thinking








School Development Plan – Well-Being Actions

- Celebrate and use mistakes as opportunities for learning
- Provide repeated opportunities to develop and practice telling their teacher and classmates about what they know and can do in math.
- Clearly display NLA oral language poster







School Development Plan – Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions

- Use scaffolded learning intentions (i.e., learners may have different learning goals)
- Nurture student confidence and skill in using complete sentences and appropriate vocabulary to express their math understanding and actions.
- Increase diverse representation in math talk resources
